WHAT IS OLLI?

OLLI is an acronym for The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at Bradley University, an organization of more than 1,200 members who are at least 50 years old and who want to stay vital and active as they reach and enjoy retirement. One of the best ways to do that is to keep learning, and OLLI offers many options to do so.

Our members enjoy the best of life-after-50 with a diverse collection of year-round programs, including non-credit classes, educational travel, study groups, and special events. Our online options allow members to learn via Zoom, a free and easy-to-use video conferencing program.

Please review our program options, both in-person and online, so you can pick what best fits your learning preferences, interests, and schedule.

OLLI Originals are exclusive talks with local leaders and businesses from the community and beyond. These one-hour sessions are a great way to stay informed about local issues, governmental updates, and business updates.



Study Groups offer opportunities to investigate topics in depth, and are your connection to studying what you most enjoy with people who share your enthusiasm. The groups are participation-based; the facilitators deliver core learning material, but all participants learn by sharing. Participants should expect to read, watch a video, or complete other independent study outside of each group session. Groups start at various times throughout the month, and usually meet for 1.5 to 2 hours for 4 - 6 weeks. Seats are often limited to 15 - 25 participants so everyone has an opportunity to actively participate.

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Learning Trips enable members to interact with experts who offer behind-the-



scenes looks at area businesses, and regional, national, and worldwide attractions. Our online "Travel Beyond" trips let members travel virtually via Zoom. Our hybrid "Support Local" includes a curbside meal pickup followed by a Zoom presentation that allows members to go behind the scenes with owners and chefs.

Online Social Events are hosted by OLLI volunteers several times a month. Each free happy hour has a theme, but you don't have to share - just pop in and enjoy!

Online Zoom Training sessions help members learn how to use the software on their computers, tablets, or smartphones. Led by OLLI volunteers and free to all, our goal is to help members feel comfortable with the technology so they can enjoy their OLLI Online experiences.

OLLI Classes Imagine learning only about the topics you choose, taught by engaging volunteer instructors, on a college campus, with people your age, and no tests or grades. Add time for socializing, and you have a sense



of what we love to do. Classes meet at Bradley University on Wednesdays in April and October, and we're working on a new program format for January and February. We provide a friendly, welcoming environment on campus, with free parkand-ride service to drop you off at the front door. Classes are held at 9:00, 10:30, 12:30, and 2:30 and with our new a la carte registration you can sign up for 1, 2, 3 or all 4 sessions.

director of Project Implicit, Peoria native, and sixth year doctoral student in American Studies at Brown University. She will discuss the intersection of race and space in the formation of Los Angeles's Chinatown during the twentieth century. In November 1892, one of the heated battles between the Hop Sing and Bing Kong was fought over a young woman named Choo Fong. This became a rallying point for the local press, the police, and the growing mission movement seeking to regain control over the increasingly powerful immigrant population. \$15 per person includes presentation. 3. World Heritage Sites in the U.S. with Dr. Doug Comer

The U.S. National Committee of the International Council on Monuments and Sites (US/ICOMOS) promotes the conservation of world heritage and stronger connections to the global heritage community through advocacy, education, and the international exchange of people and ideas. The U.S. is home to 23 World Heritage sites. These sites are cultural and natural treasures to the world. The United States was the first nation to propose a "World Heritage Trust" in 1965. Yellowstone National Park became the first World Heritage

site in 1978. Join Dr. Douglas Comer, President of the International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS) United States National Committee, as he discusses the mission of US/ICOMOS and how their work impacts global heritage sites around the United States. \$10 per person

I. Listen to Their Stories:

The Words of Native American Writers Mondays, August 16, 30, Sept 13, 27, 1:00 – 3:00 p.m. Peoria Next, 801 W. Main Street

Join us as we read and discuss the works of selected gifted Native American poets, short story writers and novelists, all winners of current literary awards and honors. We will study the works



of Louise Erdrich, Tommy Orange, Sherman Alexie, Joy Harjo, Natalie Diaz, and others as we "listen" to their experience of life in contemporary America. While there are 574 recognized Indigenous tribal nations and therefore no single perspective or voice, we hope that an overview of the joys, successes, and struggles shared by these writers will enrich our understanding of their experience. In order for participants to fully enjoy the reading selections, we have scheduled our meetings two weeks apart. Further, all reading materials will be available online, from the public library, and delivered to participants' closest libraries (please contact Roberta Koscielski at RobertaKoscielski@ppl. Peoria.lib.il.us) or provided as a PDF by our poetry leader, Dr. Claire McQuerry.

August 16: short stories, both available online: *Fleur* by Louise Erdrich and What You Pawn I Will Redeem by Sherman Alexie.

August 30: Round House, a novel by Louise Erdrich, copies available through the Peoria Public Library.

2. Is the Painting Good, Bad, or Great? Art Appreciation 101 Fridays September 3 - 24 10:00 a m - 12:00 a

During this study group we will discuss the often-hidden significance of paintings and learn their deeper meanings. Questions will be explored such as what was the artist's purpose in each painting? We'll also focus on the basic art elements of color, composition, and symbolism. During our exploration of selected paintings, we will use the knowledge we have gained to obtain a new level of art appreciation and understanding. Trips to art galleries will no longer intimidate us!

3. Redefining Aging Mondays, September 13 – October 18, 1:30 – 3:10 p.m.

Methodist College, 7600 N Academic Drive, Peoria

In this study group, participants will collaborate with Methodist College students who are enrolled in an introductory course in gerontology. We'll discuss Elderhood: Redefining Aging, Transforming Medicine, Reimagining Life by Louise Aronson. This is the fourth year we have done this collaboration with the Methodist nursing students, which has been equally rewarding for both the students and OLLI participants as they worked to learn from each other. This year, we're excited to be using a new book by Dr. Aronson, who has both an MFA in fiction from the Warren Wilson Program for Writers and an MD from Harvard Medical School. She has won more than five awards for her writing and is an Associate Professor of Medicine at UCSF. We'll also discuss some of Aronson's writings about the impact of this pandemic on older adults (one notable article was titled, "COVID kills only old people. Only?") Our weekly discussions allow everyone to learn from each other, especially around the issues and emotions associated with the process of aging in American society. Participants will need to obtain and read Elderhood Redefining Aging, Transforming Medicine, Reimagining Life by Louise Aronson, which was a finalist for this year's Pulitzer Prize in non-fiction writing, available at local and online retailers and libraries. \$45 — Facilitated by Majorie Getz, a professor of arts and sciences at Methodist College and frequent OLLI facilitator and instructor.

4. Codes and Codebreaking Tuesdays, September 14 – October 19, 9:30 – 11:30 a.m. Peoria Next, 801 W. Main Street

As society becomes more complex there is a greater need for communication. At the same time there is an increase in the need to hide communications from some people, while facilitating their delivery to the people for whom they are intended. In this study group, we will explore the basics of codes and codebreaking. We'll also discuss some of the interesting stories of how codes and codebreaking have changed historical events. This group will require active participation, including outside study, presentation of reports, and completion of exercises. Participants need to obtain and read the book: *The Code Book: The Science of Secrecy from Ancient Egypt to Quantum Cryptography* by Simon Singh, which is available on-line (hard copy or e-book) for under \$20. Internet access will be necessary for participants. \$45 — Facilitated by York Phillips, frequent OLLI facilitator and instructor.

5. Fundraising 101: Post-Covid 19 Planning for Small Charities, Churches, and Synagogues Thursdays, September 23 – October 14, 1:00 – 3:15 p.m.

Once again we are offering this popular study group for those who would like to learn more about the steps of successful fundraising. One of the challenges of fundraising for small charities and religious institutions is doing more with less. Most are understaffed by volunteers with limited budgets and little training or experience. Compounding the challenge has been COVID-19 and the shutting down of in-person events and personal calling. The principles of fundraising have not changed - so what are the next steps that a charity should take, now that the COVID restrictions have been lifted? The answer to that question and more will be addressed in this study group. \$45 – facilitated by Ken Lewis, retired director of planned giving, Northwestern Memorial Hospital.

"Travel" Beyond Peoria, part of OLLI's Online Learning Trips, is an opportunity to travel virtually via Zoom to visit museums, attractions, and speakers around the world.

I. Japanese American National Museum Tuesday, August 31, 12:00 – 1:00 p.m.

Join OLLI as we explore the Japanese American National Museum (JANM) virtually. JANM is located in Los Angeles, California, and dedicated to preserving the history and culture of Japanese Americans. In this visit, we will explore *Common Ground: The Heart of Community*, the Japanese American National Museum's on-going core exhibition. This collection-based guided visual presentation will chronologically explore the Japanese American experience from the 1860s through the post-war era, with an emphasis on the WWII incarceration experience. Led by JANM volunteer docents and facilitators, history comes alive and participants engage in lifelong learning. This event will not be recorded.

2. Rocky Mountain National Park Monday, September 20, 12:00 – 1:00 p.m.

Rocky Mountain National Park in northern Colorado spans the Continental Divide and encompasses protected mountains, forests, and alpine tundra. It's known for the Trail Ridge Road and the Old Fall River Road, drives that pass aspen trees and rivers. Join a park ranger to examine the essence of Rocky Mountain National Park and the changes seen here over the past 100 years in wildlife, wildfire, and human use. How can this National Park stay unchanged in the midst of changing circumstances? \$15 per person

All trips depart from Campustown shopping center, near Bradley University, with reserved parking on trip days.

Get to know your community on these half-day excursions to local sites. The price includes meal, shuttle transportation, entrance fees, and tour guides.

To make your trip even more enjoyable, please note:

- All learning trip times in this brochure are approximate and subject to change. Please refer to your confirmation handout (emailed prior to the trip date) for specific departure, tour, and arrival times.
- Many of our learning trips require walking and standing in various terrains and environments.
 To ensure your safety and to respect our hosts' regulations, everyone is required to wear closedtoed shoes on all our trips.

ACTIVITY LEVELS

Each learning trip includes an activity level symbol. **Before** you register, make sure the activity level matches your abilities. This will ensure an enjoyable trip for you and those who travel with you.

- Enter/exit vehicle with minimal assistance, climb some stairs, stand for up to an hour, and walk a few blocks indoors or out.
- 2 Stand for over an hour, climb some flights of stairs, and walk on uneven surfaces, plus all Level 1 requirements.
- Be able to stand and walk for over 2 hours with minimal chance for sitting, be active for an extended period of time, be healthy, mobile, and able to participate in 3-5 hours of daily physical activity, plus all Level 1 and 2 requirements.
- 4 Be able to participate in extended walking and standing beyond normal trip expectations, be able to participate in 6 hours of moderate physical activity, plus all Level 1, 2, and 3 requirements.

I. Hiking St. Mary's Cemetery and Horse Shoe Bottoms with Dave Pittman 1234 Tuesday, August 3, 8:45 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.

David Pittman, environmental activist and frequent OLLI hike instructor, will lead our group at Horseshoe Bottoms located along Kickapoo Creek near Rocky Glen Park, St. Mary's Cemetery, and Madison Golf Course. The Friends of Horseshoe Bottoms envision their long-term restoration effort will create an area full of native wildlife and biodiversity. During the hike, Dave will identify wetland, riparian zone, and mesic prairie. Please note this trip will require two hours of hiking. Participants must meet Level 4 activity requirements in order to take part in this learning trip.

2. Scottish Rite Cathedral with Greg Birkland and Jenny Parkhurst 12

Thursday, August 12, 9:45 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.

Join OLLI as we find out about the exciting rejuvenation of a Peoria landmark with Greg Birkland, CEO and Jenny Parkhurst, Executive Director of Performing Arts, both of KDB Group. We will start at the Scottish Rite Cathedral, which was built in 1925 with stunning stained-glass windows, flying buttresses, and a working theatre with majestic acoustics. Greg will explain why and how Kim Blickenstaff, a San Diego businessman and developer, has invested in the Peoria area and show us the updated building. The building has more than 10,000 square feet of useable space, theater seating for 900, a full basement kitchen, and banquet facility.

3. JUMP Training Simulation and Education Center with Scott Barrows 12 Friday, August 20, 8:45 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.

The Jump Trading Simulation and Education Center is a virtual care delivery setting that replicates patient care with actual medical equipment and state-of-the-art simulation devices that provide the highest level of medical research, training, and innovation to attract the finest minds in clinical education. Join OLLI as Scott Barrows, Director OSF Innovation Design Lab, Clinical Assistant Professor, Biomedical Visualization, UIC Medical Center and Clinical Assistant Professor, Emergency Medicine, University of Illinois College of Medicine Peoria takes us on a tour of the facility.

4. Blue Ridge Community Farm and Picket Fences 125

Friday, August 27, 9:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.

Laura and Jim Sniff have long known the benefits of a day in the country for their cognitively disabled son, so they share that joy with other special needs kids and adults. The couple runs Blue Ridge Community Farm, a nonprofit, 245-acre working farm near Chillicothe for adults and children with special needs. We'll visit the farm to learn more about the free educational field trips they hold for special education and life skills classes throughout central Illinois. The trips typically include interacting with farm animals, music, crafts, hay rack rides, and learning opportunities revolving around crops grown on the farm, animal care, and general farm knowledge. We'll have the opportunity to tour the farm which is home to ten alpacas, four donkeys, chickens, a horse, and two lovable golden retrievers. After lunch, we will tour the newest part of the operation in Chillicothe, Picket Fence, a full service floral, gift and garden center where adults with disabilities will have opportunities for employment and skill training in all aspects of the business.

5. der Bauernhof Alpaca Farm 1 2 5 Friday, September 10, 8:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.

Join OLLI for a tour of der Bauernhof Farms, an alpaca farm located east of Bloomington. Owners Stan and Janetta Bauer breed and raise alpacas for the purpose of producing and spinning high-quality yarn from the animals' fiber. They also work with local artisans to create unique clothing from the yarn that has been dyed and spun. During our visit, we will learn about the breeding and shearing techniques, and observe the entire process of taking fiber and spinning it into yarn.

6.Tres Rojas Winery 12 3 Tuesday, September 14, 11:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.

Learn about wine making and wine tasting with this behind-the-scenes look at Tres Rojas Winery, located just west of Washington in Tazewell County. Lisa and Bob Barry, owners of the new vineyard, will guide our private tour of the vineyard and production area, and talk about the process of winemaking, vine to glass. They will share their story and even offer advice on pruning your backyard grapevines or home wine-making. Our tour will include a tasting of at least five wines.

7. Discover Peoria Walking Tour with J.D. Dalfonso 1 2 3

Join OLLI as we explore Peoria with J.D. Dalfonso, CEO of Discover Peoria, also known as the Peoria Area Conventions and Visitors Bureau, a nonprofit organization that promotes the Peoria area as a destination and contributes to the economic growth of its communities. During this tour we will be walking through the downtown and warehouse district and learn what is new and happening in the Peoria area.

9. Peoria County Coroner 1 Tuesday, September 28, 8:45 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.

Meet our Peoria County Coroner, Jamie Harwood, an elected official charged with investigating sudden, unusual, or traumatic deaths and assuring a scientific, forensic investigation is completed. Our visit will include a discussion about why the coroner investigates a death, what a typical day is like, a tour of the autopsy room and morgue, as well as a question and answer period. Harwood, a Certified Forensic Nurse, will also discuss how the office provides advocacy for the survivors, justice for the deceased, and a determination of cause and manner of death with the most efficient, evidenced-based, best practice methods.


- \$10 minimum cancellation fee
