



WHAT IS OLLI ONLINE?

OLLI is an acronym for The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at Bradley University, an organization of more than 1,200 members who are at least 50 years old and who want to stay vital and active as they reach and enjoy retirement. One of the best ways to do that is to keep learning, and OLLI offers many options to do so.

OLLI Online provides many virtual learning experiences delivered via Zoom, a free and easy to use video conferencing software. Meeting "live" via Zoom allows learning to continue from the comfort and safety of our own homes until we can meet in person again. Please review our current program options so you can pick what best fits your learning preferences and interests:

- Introduction to Zoom sessions help our members learn how to use the software on their computers, tablets, or smart phones. Led by a volunteer OLLI instructor and offered free of charge to all, our goal is to help you feel comfortable with the technology so you'll enjoy your experience with OLLI Online.
- OLLI Online Classes are lecture-based courses during which the instructor delivers the learning material with the opportunity for participants to ask questions either during or after the presentation. OLLI Online classes are offered monthly on Wednesdays; they meet for approximately one hour each at 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m., and 3:00 p.m.
- OLLI Online Study Groups are participation-based; the facilitator delivers core learning material, but all participants learn by sharing. OLLI Online Study Groups usually have an expectation of reading, watching a video, or other independent study outside of each session. Each group starts at various times throughout each month, and usually meet for 1.5 hours to 2 hours for four to six weeks. Seats are usually limited to 15 to 25 participants so that everyone has an opportunity to actively participate.

- OLLI Online Learning Trips includes "Travel" Beyond Peoria which is an opportunity to travel virtually via Zoom to visit museums, attractions and speakers around the world. Support Local is our program with area restaurants and businesses which include a curbside pickup, followed by a conversation or chance to go behindthe-scenes with the owner/chef the next day.
- OLLI Online Originals are exclusive talks with local leaders and businesses from the community and beyond. These one-hour sessions are a great way to keep informed about specific topics, governmental updates, or business organizations.
- OLLI Online Free and Social Events are free social events hosted by an OLLI volunteer several times a month. Each happy hour or book chat has a theme, but it's not necessary to share just pop in and enjoy!

ONLINE CLASSES

You can sign up for one, two, three, or all four OLLI Online Classes. Each class is one hour and will meet the first four Wednesdays of the month.

I. The Women who Shaped the History of Rome 9:00 a.m.

At its height the Roman Empire had over 60 million people. Over half were women. Little is known about most of them, but a few had enormous influence and changed history. From the wives of emperors, warrior leaders, saints, and sinners, and even the Queen of Egypt, this class will discuss how these women shaped the history of Rome. \$20 — Class instructor is Janene Mattingly, past OLLI secretary and frequent instructor, retired Latin teacher at East Peoria Community High School, and avid Italy traveler.

OR

2. Women and Wealth 9:00 a.m.

Women are a powerful economic force controlling more than half of all investable assets in the US! They also have longer life expectancies and represent more than half of the population which creates a vital need to understand wealth management. This class will assist in educating you on the fundamentals of investing, estate planning and long term care planning, and will teach you how to create a wealth strategy that meets your true needs.

\$20 — Class instructor is Hiral Hudson, past OLLI instructor, Financial Planning Specialist, with the Epley-Wolbeck Group at Morgan Stanley.

3. How to Mend a Broken Heart (Or Not Break It) 11:00 a.m.

It's February, let's take care of our hearts! Join four Peoria area physicians to learn more about what you can do to protect your heart and prevent heart disease, which is still the leading cause of death in the United States. You will have the opportunity to hear from a different doctor each week. Dr. Parker McRae, Cardiologist, will speak on "It's Never too Late: Prevention of Heart Disease – An Owner's Manual" Dr. Fred Hoy, Cardiac Surgeon, will speak on "I need my aortic valve replaced, how do I choose which one, and why?" Dr. Timir Baman, Electrophysiologist, will speak on the current treatment and management of atrial fibrillation – an irregular and often rapid heart rate that can cause poor blood flow to the body. Dr. David Best, Interventional Cardiologist will speak on "Coronary Artery Disease – Where Losers and Quitters are Winners". \$20 — Class instructors are Dr. Parker McRae, Cardiologist; Dr. Fred Hoy, retired Cardiac Surgeon; Dr. Tamir Baman, Board Certified Cardiologist with specialty training in electrophysiology; Dr. David Best, retired Board Certified Cardiologist.

OR

4. State of the City of Peoria 11:00 a.m.

Peoria depends on its residents to know what is going on in our community. This class will help clarify information about city issues and serve as a discussion forum. Join Patrick Urich, Peoria City Manager, as he tackles a different topic each week. Feb. 3 - Budget in Brief: A general overview of the City's current budget and how the pandemic changed the process. Feb. 10 - Pensions and the City: What is this bill and what does it mean? Public safety pension fees, set by the State, are growing at rates that are impossible to keep up with. In this class you'll learn the background on this fee and how Peoria and other communities are facing it. Feb. 17 - The Long Road to Agreement: The City of Peoria and Combined Sewer Overflow. Feb. 24 - Looking Ahead: State and local government services in 2021 and beyond. \$20 — Class instructor is Patrick Urich, Peoria City Manager.

5. Introduction to Art Appreciation 1:00 p.m.

Have you ever looked at a painting and wondered what it is that makes it famous? This class will discuss questions such as, what is art, do we have to like it to appreciate it, what are the elements artists use to express their work, does the painting tell us a story, what were the cultural influences and events in the artist's life that directly affected their work? Although we will focus mostly on the Renaissance and Baroque, we will briefly cover the major art movements leading up those two periods. The movements from the mid-18th century to the modern era will be covered in Art Appreciation 102 in the OLLI Spring session.

6. More Grace and Grandeur – The Story of Four of Europe's Iconic Churches I:00 p.m.

Explore the fascinating history behind the founding, design, and building of four of Europe's celebrated churches, all part of UNESCO World Heritage sites. We'll visit four different countries, starting with France, for a look at Notre Dame de Paris, tragically damaged this year by fire. We'll continue in Italy with Santa Maria del Fiore in Florence, the world's third largest cathedral. Next up will be Canterbury Cathedral in England, seat of the worldwide Anglican Communion. We'll conclude with La Gagrada Familia, a highly controversial design still under construction in Barcelona, Spain. In addition to the history, we'll look at the architectural styles and features associated with these beautiful interiors and exteriors.

7. Uncommon Story of Common Materials 3:00 p.m.

Everything that we see and touch is a material. Many of these common materials actually have fascinating stories about how the material was discovered, commercially developed for everyday use, and / or incorporated into our daily lives. John Amdall will share his learning journey on the exploration of materials and share the uncommon stories about common materials (including concrete, steel, salt, chocolate, vanilla, paper, and water) that we too often just take for granted. Why does today's concrete quickly crumble, but the Roman concrete is still being used today? Did you know that the best coffee is first "digested" by a cat-like creature? Why does the Mona Lisa painting look so different today than when originally painted? We will explore the backstory on these and many other questions. \$20 — Class instructor is John Amdall OLLI President and frequent OLLI instructor.

8. Get Excited for Spring with Tips to Cultivate Your Garden 3:00 p.m.

Get excited for spring gardening! If you are looking to improve your supply of fresh vegetables, consider starting your own garden. This class will cover the basics of starting, organizing, and implementing your own garden, including what you need to know to be successful. We will also touch on sharing the effort with others through a community garden. Learn why seed starting is a great way to prepare for our spring gardens.

Judge Bennett has a pending National Science Foundation grant to run 9 separate empirical studies about Afrocentric facial feature bias in both the criminal and civil justice systems. Join OLLI for this thoughtful discussion of Judge Bennett's research in implicit bias in the criminal justice system.

Study Groups offer an opportunity to investigate a topic in depth. Most study groups typically meet once a week for four to six weeks.

I. Jewish Traditions Tuesdays, February 16 - March 9, 1:00 - 3:00 p.m.

Jewish life is all about consecrating time. The term consecration is also used to mark the beginning of formal Jewish study. Join this study group to learn more about Judaism, the world's oldest monotheistic religion, dating back nearly 4,000 years. We will examine the weekly Shabbat (Sabbath) and Jewish life cycle events such as bar mitzvahs and weddings. We'll also explore the different Jewish Holy Days, like Passover, Yom Kippur, and Rosh Hashanah--what do they signify and how they occur at designated times each year. ONLINE LEARNING TRIPS "TRAVEL" Beyond Peoria

"Travel" Beyond Peoria, part of OLLI's Online Learning Trips, is an opportunity to travel virtually via Zoom to visit museums, attractions and speakers around the world.

I.Travel with OLLI to U.S. National Archives Thursday, February 4, 12:00 p.m.

Explore the complex story of the fight for women's right to vote through some of the historically valuable records of the United States government that are preserved at the National Archives. We will discuss petitions, photographs, and other documents that help tell the story leading up to and beyond the ratification of the 19th Amendment. Join OLLI as we visit the U.S. National Archives with Judy Luis-Watson who manages the Volunteer and Education Programs at the modern archival facility in College Park, Maryland. We will also learn how to connect with the National Archives online for research, Citizen Archivist Missions, and public programs.

2. Travel with OLLI to Kenai Fjords National Park Listening to the Ice

Monday, February 8, 12:00 p.m.

Kenai Fjords National Park has always been a place to examine change. The park is referenced as a "window to past ice ages" and "a place where the ice age still lingers." Visitors have come to the park to be reminded of the Earth's most recent glaciation, the Wisconsin glacial period when the Cordilleran ice sheet rested thousands of feet thick atop the Kenai Peninsula. In recent years, Kenai Fjords, along with many of Alaska's national parks, has also become a place to examine the future of climate change for our nation and our planet. Glacier Lead Interpretation Ranger Leah Wold will be our guide to Listening to the Ice program.

3. Travel with OLLI to Smithsonian American Art Museum and American Battle Monuments Commission cemeteries Friday, February 19, 12:00 p.m.

As sites of our national memory, American Battle Monuments Commission (ABMC) cemeteries honor the service and sacrifice of US soldiers overseas. As the national institution that documents America's stories through art, the Smithsonian American Art Museum (SAAM) reveals key aspects of America's culture and history through its collection. Honor, sacrifice, and service are themes that artists and cemetery designers have brought to life using many different forms of symbolism and allegories. During this program, representatives of ABMC and SAAM help contextualize the history of memorials, monuments, and art in their "collections." Participants will compare what specific artworks and cemeteries meant when first created versus what they mean now. Explore the visual elements of sculpture, architecture and 2-dimensional works to understand how the design of their respective compositions work together to convey these themes.

4.Travel with OLLI to Frank Lloyd Wright's Robie House

Thursday, February 25, 12:00 p.m.

Inspired by the expansive landscape of the Midwest prairie, Wright's Robie House is the most famous of the architect's groundbreaking Prairie houses. The Frederick C. Robie House is a U.S. National Historic Landmark now on the campus of the University of Chicago. Completed in 1910, the house is recognized today as one of the most important buildings of the 20th century. It is inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List. Join OLLI for a guided walk of the museum.

5. Travel with OLLI to Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York

Civil Rights: Before You Could Say "Jackie Robinson" Friday, February 26, 12:00 p.m.

Join OLLI as we take a journey through the history of African American Baseball players from the 1860s to the 1960s. "Jackie Robinson made my success possible," said Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. "Without him, I would never have been able to do what I did." Dr. King's lasting work as a Civil Rights pioneer touched all areas of the American experience, yet he credited a baseball player with making his dream viable. Once Robinson was allowed to demonstrate his ability in the big leagues, the doors appeared open to everyone. It was a message that only baseball – with its power to cut across cultures – could deliver. \$20 per person
