Interested in Teaching Abroad?

Bradley faculty members who are interested in teaching abroad in one of Bradley's Interim Programs Abroad (or any other international academic program) are invited to express their interest and receive information about how they might become involved.

The first question the Study Abroad Office asks is: what are you interested in teaching, and where? If you're not already familiar with our programs, begin by familiarizing yourself with two documents posted in this tab: "OEA Interims Programs Abroad - Courses and Venues since 2015" will give you the range of Bradley courses that have been offered in recent years, and where, and which of those courses enrolled. Not all courses do achieve adequate minimum enrollment (generally 10 students), including some terrific courses offered by terrific faculty people. Next, the necessary document titled "Policies for Faculty" will provide details about policies for faculty teaching in Bradley's Interim Programs Abroad or any other faculty-led program abroad.

For more specific ideas of what teaching in the Interim Program Abroad is like, your colleagues are a great resource! Feel free to discuss your interest with faculty members identified in the program list, particularly if you're interested in a specific venue. Of course you are also welcome to contact Christine Blouch, Director of Education Abroad, to discuss your interest.
