 - A. Chief Joschko and Nathan Thomas
 1. Thomas: Important to have a conversation as a community as opposed to a press conference or briefing. I know you all have questions, some of which we will not be allowed to answer or do not have answers for. I ask that this is off the record please. Thank you to the Bradley Police for their incredible response, care, and compassion, and thank you to my staff who has been on and provided counseling.
 2. Chief: Thank you for the invitation, going to cover two main things, synopsis of what happened early Sunday morning, and provide the differentiation between the safety alert email and Forewarn text system we use.

- a) Please provide information if you have any. This includes anything that led up to incident, after incident, or during incident. Any and all information is helpful.

- b) Difference in systems:
 - (1) Both somewhat put into place by Federal Government. Special requirement placed on universities to provide this information
 - (2) Timely Warning: Safety Alert - serve as a notice to students, faculty, staff of incidents that have occurred and are possibly still ongoing, meaning no suspect or suspect was not immediately apprehended.
 - (a) Informative in nature, provide general safety tips
 - (b) Decision to issue determined by Chief
 - (3) Emergency Notification: ForeWarn Alert - instruction for specific emergency action to take place such as lockdown, evacuation, etc.
 - (a) Not informational purpose, action needs to be taken. Same type of thing as a fire alarm in a building
 - (b) Text messaging, telephone line, email messaging, audix messaging (voicemail) - usually for staff, public address announcements, Twitter (Bradley University), university's main homepage - banner at top
 - (c) Decision to issue is determined by BUPD supervisor on duty on confirmation of a significant emergency that involves an immediate threat of something that is occurring on campus
 - (4) Federal mandates these to occur on campus. We are more transparent than that and do these for a off campus locations as well. Have to impact safety and security of students.
