The leadership minor is designed to provide students with the information, experience, and opportunities necessary to gain an in-depth knowledge of leadership theory and practice. Courses in the program integrate students' leadership experiences on campus and in the community.

This interdisciplinary minor is a collaboration between the College of Education and Health Sciences and the Foster College of Business. It is only 15 hours, so it can easily fit in with many majors. There are electives offered from every college and most of the electives are also a part of the core curriculum. Any undergraduate student can take leadership minor courses.
