- III. Approval of Minutes
 - A. Third Regular University Senate Meeting, November 18, 2010.
 A motion and a second were made to accept the Minutes from the November 18, 2010 meeting. Passed by general consent.

V. Report from Standing Committees

A. Subcommittee on Academic Regulations and Degree Requirements

 Brian Huggins apologized for some of the hard to read print. It is due to copies of copies finally being inserted in the agenda. The hard to read print is narrative in the admissions section of the catalog regarding credit by examination. The motion the senate will consider is not this specific language.

- The report from the subcommittee concerns an eligibility restriction for transferring in non-resident credit earned via CLEP. Based on this report, the Senate Executive Committee, with the approval of the chairs of C&R and the subcommittee, chose to state the restriction in positive form as follows.

"Only students who have earned less than 90 semester hours of credit can transfer CLEP credit to Bradley University."

Furthermore, if the motion passes, a memo will be sent from the Senate Exec to the VPAA's office stating that the change should be included clearly and accurately in the appropriate sections of the online catalog.

Claire Etaugh made a motion that the wording be changed from "less" to "fewer."

ID 33215 ACJ Criminal Justice Studies

Summary: Due to the creation of the new Department of Criminal Justice Studies, it is necessary to change the major and course prefixes from LAS-

ACJ to LAS-CJS. At this point in time, we are not modifying the existing program of study (formerly ACJ); rather, we are changing the name of the major from ACJ to CJS for consistency with the new CJS department. While plans concerning additional program modifications (e.g., a modified curriculum) are underway, they are not presently being proposed. The course modifications do not in any way alter the current program of study; the course additions will eventually be, but are not presently, integrated.
