IV. Reports from Administrators

A. President Glasser

- 1) Twenty graduating seniors participated in a special graduation ceremony (student athletes and engineering students in the Formula SAE Competition).
- 2) Eighty-two students will attend the Summa Dinner on Wednesday, May 13. Dr. Janet Jackson will be speaking on behalf of faculty.
- 3) The Undergraduate Commencement will be held at the Civic Center's Carver Arena at 8:45 a.m. Saturday, May 16. The Graduate Commencement will be held on campus in the Renaissance Coliseum at 1:45 P.M., Saturday, May 16
- 4) Dr. Kelly McConnaughay and Jenny Gruening Burge were awarded the President's Award for co-chairing the General Education Revision Steering Committee

B. Provost Glassman

- 1) The Strategic Planning Committee continues the program review in alignment with the framing elements: quality, centrality, marketability, and cost effectiveness.
- 2) All of the summer workshops for the faculty have been filled.
- 3) Please follow the end of the semester procedures and give your final exams at their scheduled times. Please get your grades in on time.

C. Vice President for Business Affairs, Gary Anna

 On March 30, the University community was informed that personally identifiable information may have been compromised due to malware that was discovered on two University computers. The University is cooperating with authorities, including the FBI, as they continue to investigate the issue. The FBI has not confirmed that the University system or personal identification information was indeed breached. However, as a precaution, Bradley is offering a one-year subscription to LifeLock, an identity alert and credit monitoring system, at no charge.

- 2) The most important financial data derives from the university's enrollment. Financial assessments related to those data will be forthcoming.
- 3) Bradley will not have an approved budget until later this summer.
- 4) The University's endowment value was \$288.8 million at the end of March 2015.

D. Vice President of Enrollment Management, Paul Schroeder

- 1) A large share of graduating high school students do not yet fully appreciate the highquality Bradley experience and the accompanying ROI.
- 2) The accomplishments of EM this year include:
 - a) addressed 263,000 prospects, a 70,000 (34.3%) increase;
 - b) there were 38,000 (+3.5%) more inquiries from students who indicated an interest in Bradley University;
 - c) there were over 9,100 applications (+100) more applications from 606XX, a group that is less likely to be academically or financially able to attend Bradley;
 - d) there were 600 (12%) more campus visits of upcoming Fall freshmen relative to last year, and
 - e) there are 939 deposits.
- 3) Changes made by EM this year included:
 - a) implementation of the Faculty Fellows program that included over 100 faculty members;
 - b) modification of the Visit Program that allows for more time for faculty to meet with prospects;
 - c) new publications: *Profile*, *Viewbook*, and *Yield*;
 - d) altered financial aid plans to draw in more middle income households;
 - e) holding high school counselor luncheons in Chicago area;
 - f) improved social media efforts by University Marketing and Admissions; and
 - g) messaging of Bradley as a mid-sized, comprehensive university.

V. Report from Student Senator, Sarah Handler

- The Student Senate cabinet had a retreat for planning the coming year. A vision statement was created for the Student Senate Executive Cabinet: "The 2015-2016 Student Senate Cabinet will empower students and organizations at Bradley University to become more unified, collaborative, and involved, by serving the Student Body with accountability, inclusivity, visibility, and approachability."
- 2) The Student Senate hopes to generate more interaction between University Senate & Student Senate. Three students will speak in support of the Transgender Rights Resolutions today.

1. Resolution 1 – Amend official non-discrimination and sexual harassment policies (Motion Robert Hawkins; 2nd Wayne Evens on April 17, 2015)

Whereas some members of the Bradley community--faculty, staff, and students--are wrestling with existential questions of their true gender identity and expression within a general cultural context of misunderstanding and/or malice;

And whereas Bradley's official non-discrimination and sexual harassment statements do not adequately protect transgender individuals;

And whereas Bradley is striving toward distinction in all of its endeavors, including the equal and humane treatment of all its employees and students;

Let it hereby be resolved that Bradley University improve its protections for the equal rights of our transgender colleagues, students, and friends by making the following change with all possible speed:

BU's official non-discrimination and sexual harassment policies should be amended to guarantee equal legal and police protection for transgender individuals, as follows:

a. ND policy statement:

Bradley University is committed to a policy of non-discrimination and the promotion of equal opportunities for all persons regardless of age, color, creed, disability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity and expression, marital status, national origin, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status. The University is committed to compliance with all applicable laws regarding non-discrimination, harassment and affirmative action.

b. SH policy statement:

Sexual harassment is any verbal or physical conduct that denigrates, threatens, or shows hostility toward another employee because of that employee's gender or gender identity and expression.

And whereas Bradley's current insurance plans specifically exclude complete health coverage for transgender individuals in violation of Illinois state law;

And whereas Bradley is striving toward distinction in all of its endeavors, including the equal and humane treatment of all its employees and students;

Let it hereby be resolved that Bradley University improve its protections for the equal rights of our transgender colleagues, students, and friends by taking the following step with all possible speed:

The university administration should undertake negotiations to improve our insurance options so that they include complete health care coverage for transgender individuals.
