IV. Reports from Administrators

A. Interim President Liberty

- 1) This weekend is family weekend. Saturday the Parent's Board meets and that Evening Vice President Thomas, Dr. Reynolds and I will present the "parent of the year" award.
- 2) I will be a guest on WMBD's morning show on Tuesday at 6:30am.
- 3) The OLLI Fall Kickoff Luncheon is on Wednesday, and that evening is the Lighting of the B.
- 4) The Centurion Dinner is on Thursday evening.
- 5) Our annual Founder's Day ceremony and luncheon is on Friday.
- 6) Tomorrow we will announce the winners of the awards to be given at Founder's Day ceremonies. There are four Centurion awards one is in the Caterpillar College of Engineering and Technology, one is in the Foster College of Business, and one is in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. We are going to present a Centurion Award to a College of Education and Health Sciences alum in Savanah, GA in late October.
- 7) Next Friday evening we will crown the Homecoming King and Queen.
- 8) I appeal to all of you to play an active role in seeking out and implementing positive changes that will improve the health of the University and ensure an ever increasing exceptional learning experience for all of our students. Collaboration is key to unleashing the full creative and innovative potential that exists here.

B. Interim Provost Sattler

- 1) The university conference was August 18 more than 400 faculty and staff participated. Award winners were: Dr. Jennifer Barajas received the first year faculty award. Four Caterpillar Professorships were renewed including Dr. Robert Fuller, Dr. Kevin Stein, Dr. Kyle Dzapo, and Dr. Allen Huffcutt. The outstanding academic advisor for the year was Dr. Elena Gabor. Three major initiatives were topics. They were: 1) the Bradley Core Curriculum with workshops during the summer and fall, 2) distance education programs with 99 students enrolled in the graduate nursing programs while recruiting for the January launch of the counseling programs, and 3) recruitment of international students for both undergraduate and graduate programs.
- 2) The university welcomed 54 new faculty and staff members.
- 3) On August 24, the Faculty Forum was attended by 131 members.
- 4) This past summer a voluntary retirement program was offered to 21 faculty members that were more than 70 years old. Five faculty members took the offer.
- 5) The university has obtained a site license for New York Times for students and faculty. It is available in digital format. The colleges and library are sharing the cost through operating funds.

C. Vice President Anna

- 1) The University has followed through on the Senate resolution regarding addition of transgender medical benefits and is also in the process of revising the AA-EEOC statement. The latter change is subject to finalizing assessment of impacts on student affairs policies and practices.
- 2) The University completed the 2014-15 fiscal year ended May 31, with a balanced budget. The current year operating budget has been approved, and while not robust, does contain a very modest provision for salary increase.
- 3) The University is approaching a very important part of the fiscal planning cycle, given current enrollments and related trends. A variety of campus actions, including distance learning, graduate education, social media marketing and other strategies have capacities to reverse overall enrollment and fiscal trends, but the next 6-8 weeks should provide better substantive data support for outlooks. In the meantime, campus efforts continue to be meaningful to fiscal outcomes.
