Policy: Personal Symptom Monitoring and Reporting – COVID19

Purpose: To outline requirements to reduce risk of exposure and transmission of the COVID19 virus in Nursing Students and guidelines for symptoms.

Policy Statement: It is the professional responsibility of health care personnel to maintain vigilance of their own health status in order to protect their patients/clients in the health care setting. It is expected that nursing students comply with requirements from the University and practicum sites and are honest in their reporting of symptoms. Students are to follow the CDC guidelines for protecting their own health and the health of others at all times. Guidelines for prevention of the spread of COVID19 include: (Source: CDC)

- Avoiding close contact with others. Maintain at least 6 feet of distance.
- Wash your hands frequently for at least 20 seconds, using soap, water, and friction.
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer frequently.
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose, and eyes with unwashed hands.
- Wear a mask.
- Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing (use the inside of your elbow).
- Clean and disinfect frequently used surfaces.

All students are responsible for monitoring their temperature daily, or more frequently if indicated. Daily temperature checks are good practice for monitoring changes in health status.

Undergraduate Student Procedure: OSF Saint Francis and UnityPoint hospitals' procedures for reporting to practicum are to be followed. These are posted on the Sakai sites for each practicum course. If a student is unable to attend practicum, lab, or class due to experiencing symptoms of COVID19, they are to contact Bradley Health Services.

Students will follow guidelines for testing and return to class/practicum/lab procedures per the direction of Bradley Health Services.
